NOTES:

- Students who plan to transfer to the UoM must complete at least one fine arts class under the Humanities & Fine Arts general education requirement
- Students should confer with their advisor or a representative of the university to which they intend to transfer to determine the recommended history courses.
- Students who intend to transfer to UTK, UTC, TSU, or ETSU secondary education program should follow the English AA/AS TTP and not the AST TTP. ETSU, and TSU recommend that students take education courses after transfer.
- Students who intend to transfer to MTSU should be advised that Introduction to Special Education will transfer to MTSU as an elective.

Students earning an AST degree must meet the following additional degree requirements:

- Attainment of a 2.75 cumulative grade point average (GPA)
- ACT Composite score of 21 (or SAT score of 1080) or higher or successful completion of approved standardized examination (Praxis Core) for admission to the university's College of Education
- Satisfactory ratings on an index of suitability for the teaching profession (disposition forms)

Students transferring to a public university in Tennessee may need to meet additional requirements to gain admittance to the university.
